Then Paul stood in front
of the Areopagus and

Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art

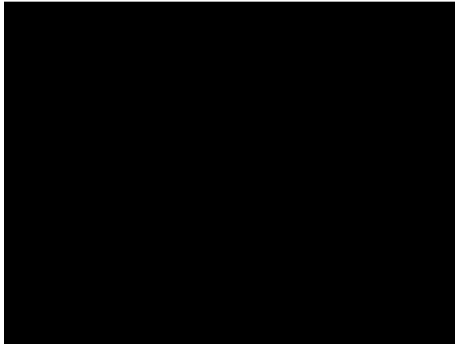

day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead." ***

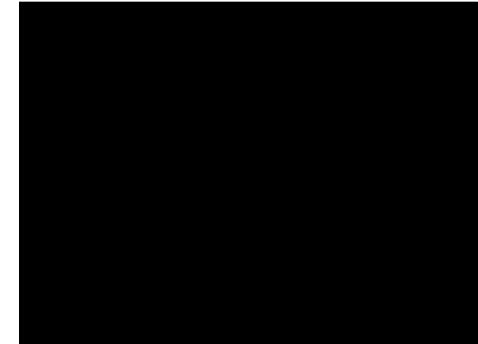

Leader: we have built up walls of prejudice.

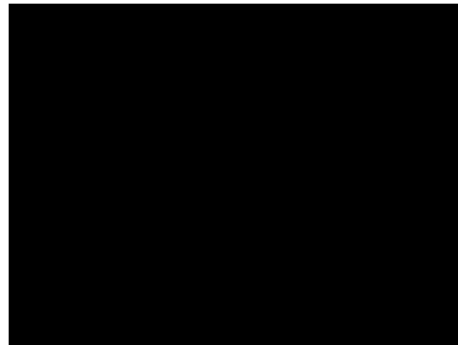
